The South Creake Lectures: food for the mind and soul

his thought, first raised a few years by Fr Roger Arguile, a retired clergyman helping out then in South Creake, sat quietly with the PCC until the rector, Fr Clive Wylie, got to hear of it soon after he arrived in 2012, and the result is The South Creake Lectures.

These are free lectures taking place at St Mary's. On 4 September, the lecture is 'Agincourt Revisited', to be given by the historian Dr Juliet Barker in the 600th anniversary year of that most famous of battles; on 2 October the Dean of St Albans, Dr Jeffrey John, will give a lecture entitled 'Making Sense of the Bible'.

"For me," says Fr Clive, "this was a no brainer. The church of our Lady Saint Mary is very well known in North Norfolk. The North Norfolk Music Festival uses our church for its chamber music concerts, The Yorke Trust has been putting on operas and concerts here for thirty years, and we're hosting a two-week art festival and exhibition, 'Fields of Vision', for the second time this September.

"So on top of the hundreds of pilgrims and visitors who come and see our wonderful church and worship here, and our own congregations in the Creakes Benefice, we can reach an audience ready, we hope, for spiritual and intellectual nourishment, for food for the mind and soul."

Fr Clive explains that these are not fundraising events. "We want to give something back, to educate, by giving people free access to nationally famous speakers. Just turn up and hear Juliet Barker, a top medieval historian who has written critically

Or Jeffrey John, who
